

2006 FCAT DISTRICT RESULTS

The Florida Comprehensive Assessment Test (FCAT) is a statewide assessment designed to measure students' performance on selected benchmarks in writing, reading, mathematics, and science, as defined by the Sunshine State Standards. The FCAT was developed as a result of the 1991 Education Reform and Accountability Act, which required the creation of state academic standards and an assessment program.

The Florida Department of Education (FLDOE) has reported summary scores based on All Students Tested, regardless of how long they were in attendance at a school and regardless of curriculum group For a complete report on the FCAT scores used for accountability purposes, refer to the FLDOE's *2005-2006 School Accountability Report* to obtain information on individual schools' grades and the criteria used to determine school grades.
