SUBJECT: RESULTS OF THE 2014 ACT ASSESSMENT

On August 20, 2014, the ACT, Inc. released District, state, and national results on the ACT college readiness assessment for the 2014 graduating class. These results summarize the performance of the 2014 graduating seniors who may have taken the ACT at any time during the 2011-12, 2012-13, or 2013-14 academic years. For students who took the test more than once, only the most recent test scores are included in the analyses. Results are only included for students who reported at the time of testing that they were scheduled to graduate in 2014. It should be noted that beginning in 2013, all "college reportable" scores are included, including those for students adhering to standard administration times and those with extended time accommodations. Prior to 2013, only scores for students with standard administration times were reported by the ACT, so comparisons to earlier years must be made with caution.

More students in Miami-Dade County Public Schools (M-DCPS) participated in the ACT in the class of 2014 than in the class of 2013. Scores for 15,536 of the students in the class of 2014 were reported (61%) as compared to 14,443 in the class of 2013 (58%). A steady increase in ACT participation has been observed in the state and the district since 2009, at least partially due to the expanded use of ACT scores to fulfill Florida's high school graduation test requirements.

Attachments to this memorandum include a summary of District, state, and nationwide results from 2013 to 2014 and the results for individual M-DCPS senior high schools. Individual High School Profile Reports are being sent to the principal at each high school with one or more ACT-tested graduate. National and state 2014 ACT High School Profile Reports may be accessed on ACT's website at: http://www.act.org/newsroom/data/2014. Highlights of the results include the following:

- Over 1,000 more students participated in the ACT in 2014 than in 2013, with 61% of graduating seniors participating in 2014, up from 58% in 2013.
- M-DCPS 2014 graduates' mean ACT Reading and Mathematics scores were higher than the concordant scores required to meet the high school graduation test requirements.
 - District ACT Reading scores increased slightly from 2013 to 2014, while scores in the other content areas declined slightly.

- Students from 84 M-DCPS senior high schools participated in the ACT in 2014, up from 79 in 2013.
 - In Reading, 25% of the District's participating high schools had mean ACT scores at or above the state mean, and 20% had scores above the national mean.
 - o In Mathematics, 28% of the District's participating high schools had mean ACT scores at or above the state mean, and 16% had scores above the national mean.

As with all college entrance exams, the population tested consists of self-selected students who participate on a voluntary basis. As a result, student demographic characteristics and the number and percent of students tested at each school can vary greatly both among schools and from year to year, particularly as more students take the tests in an effort to obtain concordant scores to meet high school graduation test requirements. Therefore, caution should be used in making comparisons. In addition, these reports are not indicative of the results that will be used in the high school accountability component for postsecondary readiness, which includes the highest score received on college placement tests by any enrolled student, not just graduating seniors.

MIAMI-DADE COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOLS Summary of District, State, and National Results for The ACT Graduating Class of 2014

On August 20, 2014, ACT, Inc. released District, state, and national results from students in the 2014 graduating class who chose to participate in the ACT. The ACT is a curriculum-based measure of college readiness. According the ACT Profile Report, these results reflect updated College Readiness Benchmarks for Reading and Science beginning with the 2013 Graduating Class data. Composite scores are reported in addition to subtest scores in English, Mathematics, Reading, and Science. ACT scores can range from a low of 1 to a high of 36.

This report provides information for the 2014 graduating seniors who took the ACT as sophomores, juniors, and/or seniors and who reported at the time of testing that they were scheduled to graduate in 2014. For students who took the test more than once, only the most recent test scores are included in the analysis. Beginning in 2013, ACT is including all "college reportable" scores in summary reports, which include scores for students adhering to standard administration times and those with extended time accommodations. Prior to 2013, only scores for students with standard administration times were reported by the ACT, so comparisons to earlier years must be made with this in mind. In 2014, students with the extended time accommodation comprised two percent of the M-DCPS population, three percent of the state, and four percent of the national population.

The ACT mean scores for graduating classes of 2013 and 2014 in English, Mathematics, Reading, and Science, as well as the overall Composite scores, are presented in Table 1 for the District, the state, and the nation.

Individual school ACT results for the Class of 2014 are presented in Table 2, which displays the number of test-takers at each school, as well as the mean scores for each subject area test and the accompanying Composite score. School summary score results are not presented if fewer than 10 students participated; however, the data for these schools are included in the District and state results.
