The EOCs are delivered via a computer-based test (CBT) platform. All FSA tests are delivered via the FSA Secure Browser and the NGSSS EOC Assessments via TestNav 8. The CBT tests may be scheduled based on student enrollment and technology resources. Paper-based versions are provided for students with disabilities who require allowable accommodations, as specified in their individual educational plans (IEPs) or Section 504 plans.

*The testing window in Miami-Dade County runs from July 9 through July 20, 2018. FSA Geometry and NGSSS (Biology 1 and US History) CBT tests may be administered starting on the first day of the testing window, July 9, but all administrations must be completed by the last day of the testing window, July 20. The chart above illustrates the recommended administration schedule for students enrolled in opened Summer School locations. **Students taking the Algebra 1 course at opened Summer School locations will take Algebra 1 EOC tests on July 16-17, between 10 a.m.-6p.m., with make-up testing on July 18-19.** Other eligible students who need to take the FSA Algebra 1 EOC, or EOCs for other content areas must register in advance, and will be accommodated on a space-available basis within the July 9-20 window.

** FSA EOCs are administered in two 90-minute sessions, one session per day, over two days. Any student not finished by the end of each 90-minute session may continue working through half the length of a typical school day.

NGSSS EOCs (Biology 1 and US History) are administered in one 160-minute session with a 10-minute break after the first 80 minutes. Students may not be dismissed during the first 80 minutes; however, if they complete the test in the first 80 minutes, they may be dismissed at the beginning of the 10-minute break. After the 10-minute break, students may be dismissed as they complete the test. Any student not finished by the end of the 160 minutes may continue working through the length of a typical school day. Testing must be completed within the same school day.

Important Note: Any deviation from this schedule requires written approval from the FDOE prior to implementation.
