- *The FCAT/FCAT 2.0 Retake and NGSSS EOC assessments are delivered via a computer-based test (CBT) platform called TestNav 8. The CBT tests may be scheduled based on student enrollment and technology resources. The tests may be administered on Day 1 of the testing window, but must be completed by the last day of the testing window, April 2. Paper-based versions are provided for students with disabilities who require allowable accommodations, as specified in their individual educational plans (IEPs) or Section 504 plans. Paper-based accommodations must be administered at the beginning of the test administration window.
- ** The FCAT 2.0 Reading Retake will be administered in two sessions over two days. Students have up to half of a typical school day to complete each session.
- *** The FCAT Mathematics Retake will be administered in one day. Students have up to the length of a typical school day to complete the test.
- **** The NGSSS Algebra 1 Retake EOC assessment is given in one 160-minute session with a 10-minute break after the first 80 minutes. Students may not be dismissed during the first 80 minutes; however, if they complete the test in the first 80 minutes, they may be dismissed at the beginning of the 10-minute break. After the 10-minute break, students may be dismissed as they complete the test. Any student not finished by the end of the 160 minutes may continue working. Testing must be completed within the same school day.

Note: Any deviation from this schedule requires written approval from the FLDOE prior to implementation.
