- *The FSA and NGSSS EOC Assessments are delivered via a computer-based test (CBT) platform (FSA EOC tests via the FSA Secure Browser and the NGSSS EOC Assessments via TestNav 8). The CBT tests may be scheduled based on student enrollment and technology resources. CBT tests may be administered starting on the first day of the testing window, but must be completed by the last day of the testing window, for each EOC respectively. Paper-based versions are provided for students with disabilities who require allowable accommodations, as specified in their individual educational plans (IEPs) or Section 504 plans. Paper-based accommodations must be administered at the beginning of the test administration window, April 20-May 1.
- **The FSA Algebra 1, Geometry, and Algebra 2 EOC will each be administered in two 90-minute sessions, one session per day, over two days. Any student not finished by the end of each 90-minute session may continue working through half the length of a typical school day. Testing may begin on April 20 but must be completed by May 15.
- *** The NGSSS EOC Biology 1 and Civics assessments are each given in one 160-minute session with a 10-minute break after the first 80 minutes. Students may not be dismissed during the first 80 minutes; however, if they complete the test in the first 80 minutes, they may be dismissed at the beginning of the 10-minute break. After the 10-minute break, students may be dismissed as they complete the test. Any student not finished by the end of the 160 minutes may continue working. Testing must be completed within the same school day. Testing may begin on April 20 but must be completed by May 22.

Note: Any deviation from this schedule requires written approval from the FLDOE prior to implementation.
