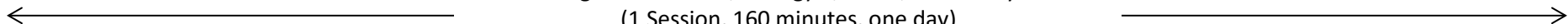

Notes:

The NGSSS EOC Assessments are delivered via TestNav8, a computer-based test (CBT) platform. The CBT tests may be scheduled based on student enrollment and technology resources. Paper-based versions are provided for students with disabilities who require allowable accommodations, as specified in their individual educational plans (IEPs) or Section 504 plans.

***The testing window in Miami-Dade County runs from November 28 through December 16, 2016.** The EOC CBT tests may be administered in any order, by school, based on needs of students within a school. One subject does not need to be completed before another begins, and subject tests may be administered concurrently. CBT testing should be completed within the least number of days possible but must be completed by the last day of the testing window. **All paper-based accommodations must be administered on Days 1 thru 10 of the test administration window, November 28 – December 9, 2016.**

**** NGSSS EOCs are administered in one 160-minute session with a 10-minute break after the first 80 minutes.** Students may not be dismissed during the first 80 minutes; however, if they complete the test in the first 80 minutes, they may be dismissed at the beginning of the 10-minute break. After the 10-minute break, students may be dismissed as they complete the test. Any student not finished by the end of the 160 minutes may continue working through the length of a typical school day. Testing must be completed within the same school day.

Any deviation from this schedule requires written approval from the Florida Department of Education prior to implementation.
