

Florida Oral Reading Fluency (FORF)

Grades/Students

Students in grades 6th – 10th scoring at FCAT Reading Level 1 and 2 will be given the Florida Oral Reading Fluency (FORF) to monitor their progress in reading during the 2007-2008 school year. Students in grades 11 and 12 not passing the FCAT Reading will also take the FORF as a progress monitoring assessment.

Date

Administered in the Fall, Mid-Year, and Spring of each school year.

Description

The Florida Oral Reading Fluency (FORF) consists of on grade-level passages that students read aloud to the teacher/reading coach for one minute. Two passages are administered at each of the assessment periods. The scores from both passages are averaged to get a raw score on words read correctly per minute (wcpm). **This assessment is given to students individually.**

Results

The scores are immediately available for determining the need for remedial reading instruction.

Basis of Test

The Florida Oral Reading Fluency is given to obtain a score which reflects a student's accuracy and fluency of words correctly read per minute. This score is then compared to a risk levels chart to serve as an indicator for grouping and instruction.
