Postsecondary Education Readiness Test (PERT)

Grades/Students

It is administered on an as-needed basis to determine eligibility for special programs (i.e. dual enrollment).

Students may also use a comparative score of 97 on the PERT Math to meet the high school graduation requirement on the Algebra I EOC assessment.

Date

Students may test on an as needed basis. Other students tested for special program eligibility may be tested throughout the year as needed.

Description

The PERT is Florida's common placement test that has been developed to align with the *Postsecondary Readiness Competencies* that Florida's faculty have identified as necessary for success in entry level college credit coursework. The PERT is a computer-adaptive assessment which identifies appropriate course placement in reading, writing and mathematics. The high school shall use the results of the test to advise the students of any identified deficiencies and to enroll 12th grade students appropriate postsecondary preparatory instruction.

Results

A score scale range from 50-150 is provided. Passing scores for PERT are <u>at or above</u> the following: 106 in reading; 103 in writing; 114 in mathematics as of October 22, 2013.
