SPRING 2015 DISTRICT SUMMARY RESULTS OF THE COMPREHENSIVE ENGLISH LANGUAGE LEARNING ASSESSMENT (CELLA)

The Florida Department of Education (FLDOE) has released statewide results from the Spring 2015 administration of the Comprehensive English Language Learning Assessment (CELLA). Specifically, state, district, and individual school summary results were released for English Language Learners (ELLs) in Grades K-12.

Beginning in the 2006-2007 school year, Florida has used CELLA to measure growth in English language proficiency for students classified as ELLs, as required by the federal No Child Left Behind Act (NCLB). CELLA is a four-skill assessment that is administered in Speaking, Listening, Reading, and Writing to all ELLs in grades K-12. It is important to note that yearly outcomes represent a cross-sectional view of English language acquisition, and any year-to-year summary comparisons are based on largely different student groups as new, beginning English language learners enter the district and join the English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) program, while other students exit the program as they become English proficient.

CELLA outcomes are reported by the FLDOE in terms of scale scores and proficiency levels for each grade level and area tested: Listening/Speaking, Reading, Writing and Total. Based on the State-approved proficiency levels, students' CELLA scores are used to determine their ESOL levels and are one factor considered in exiting students from the English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) program. Additionally, CELLA results may be used diagnostically to track students' progress over time and to identify students' strengths and weaknesses in English.

Nearly 70,000 Miami-Dade County Public School students participated in the Spring 2015 CELLA, comprising 28% of all those tested in the state. District and state summary results by grade level and area tested include the following highlights.

- Nearly 2,000 fewer ELL students took the CELLA assessment in 2015 than in 2014; due
 to the new statewide exclusion of former ELLs.
- Approximately 41% of the District's ELL students were in grades K-2.
- The average M-DCPS total mean scale score increased in grades 2, 3, 7, and 9-12.
- M-DCPS improvement outpaced the state in eight tested grade levels (1, 2, 3, 7, 9-12).
- M-DCPS students in grades 9-12 scoring "Proficient" in listening/speaking and reading increased by 3 to 9% percentage points from 2014 to 2015.
