College Board SAT REASONING TEST CLASS OF 2006 SUMMARY REPORT

The SAT Reasoning Test (SAT) is designed to assess many of the verbal and mathematics skills that are important to a student's success in college. Nationally, more than 1 million seniors in the Class of 2006 took the SAT, representing 48% of the graduating class. In Florida, over 94,600 students, or 65 % of the senior class, took the SAT. In Miami-Dade County Public Schools (M-DCPS), over 10,500 students participated in the SAT, which represents 49% of the Class of 2006 based on the October 2005 FTE.

As with all college entrance exams, the population tested consists of self-selected students who participate on a voluntary basis. As a result, student demographic characteristics and the numbers and percent of students tested at each school can vary greatly both between schools and between years. Therefore, caution should be used in making comparisons, particularly in schools with relatively low numbers of students tested.

The attached report provides the following results for the district, state, and nation:

- 1. Average scores for 2004, 2005, and 2006, and the difference from 2005 to 2006;
- 2. Average scores for participating M-DCPS schools.

Highlights of Table 1 include:

- As compared to the prior year's Verbal scores, 2006 SAT Critical Reading scores for the District remained stable, while both state and national scores declined.
- The 2006 average SAT mathematics scores declined at all levels.
- SAT average Writing scores were reported for the first time for the senior class of 2006; the District's average scores are lower than the state's and the nation's.

^{*} The new Writing Section was added in March 2005; scores are reported for the first time for the class of 2006.

• In all three subject areas tested, average scores for District students lag behind those for students across the state and the nation.

Table 2 provides the 2005 and 2006 SAT average scores and the number of students tested for each of the participating M-DCPS senior high schools. Highlights of Table 2 are as follows:

- The number of students participating in the SAT testing program decreased for the majority of schools.
- Of the 40 schools with two years of data, 24, or 60%, had higher Critical Reading scores in 2006 than their Verbal scores in 2005. In Mathematics, 21 schools, or 53% increased or maintained their average score.
- In Critical Reading, 20% of District schools (9 out of 44) with 2006 reported average scores exceeded the average score for the state, while 18% (8 out of 44) exceeded the national average score.
- In Mathematics, 20% of District schools (9 out of 44) with 2006 reported average scores exceeded the average score for the state, while 16% (7 out of 44) exceeded the national average score.
- In Writing, 23% of District schools (10 out of 44) with 2006 reported average scores exceeded the average score for the state, while 18% (8 out of 44) either met or exceeded the national average score.
