SUBJECT: RELEASE OF THE 2007 COLLEGE BOARD SAT REASONING TEST

**RESULTS** 

On August 28, 2007, the College Board released the national, state and district results for the *SAT Reasoning Test* (SAT) and *the SAT Subject Tests* for the graduating class of 2007. These results summarize the performance of the District's students in the class of 2007 who may have taken the assessments as sophomores, juniors, and/or seniors. For students who took the test more than once, the most recent test scores are included in the analyses.

Nationally, almost one and one-half million seniors in the class of 2007 took the SAT, representing 48% of the graduating class nationwide. Statewide, over 97,366 seniors participated, representing 65% of the state's graduating class. In Miami-Dade County Public Schools (M-DCPS), more than 11,660 students participated in the SAT, representing 53% of the District's class of 2007 up from 49% in 2006. Highlights of the District's SAT results and a summary of the results for individual schools are provided as attachments to this memorandum. The District's summaries for the class of 2007 are compared to those of their counterparts in 2006 and 2005; the school summaries compare 2007 to 2006 results. School Profile Reports with complete school's level results on the SAT assessment were forwarded to each school with participating students. It should be noted that the population tested consists of self-selected students who participate on a voluntary basis, as with all college entrance exams. As a result, student demographic characteristics and the number and percent of students tested may vary greatly among districts, schools, and from year to year. Therefore, caution should be used in making comparisons, particularly in schools with relatively low numbers of students tested.

## Highlights of the College Board SAT Reasoning Test Summary Report for Miami-Dade County Graduating Class of 2007

## **District Results**

- The percentage of MDCPS students participating in the College Board SAT Reasoning Test (SAT) increased from 49% in the 2006 graduating class to 53% in 2007, representing 11,660 students.
- District students' mean SAT scores increased in all three content areas (Critical Reading, Mathematics, and Writing) from 2006 to 2007.
- District gains outpaced gains/losses at both the state and national levels in all three subject areas.
- Nonetheless, for all content areas, the national mean scores were highest, followed by the state's and the district's scores.

## **Individual School Results**

- Fifty-four of the district's 62 high schools with graduating classes in 2007 had students participate in the administration of the College Board SAT.
- Of the 41 schools with two years of data, 22 or 54% had higher mean Critical Reading scores in 2007 compared to 2006. In Mathematics, 19 schools, or 46% had higher mean scores in 2007 compared to 2006.
- In Critical Reading, 24% of district schools exceeded the mean score for the state, while 21% exceeded the national mean score.
- In Mathematics, 21% of district schools exceeded the mean score for the state, while 17% exceeded the national mean score.
- In Writing, 24% of district schools exceeded the mean score for the state, while 21% exceeded the national mean score.

## MIAMI-DADE COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOLS Summary of District, State, and National Results for the SAT Reasoning Test Graduating Class of 2007

On August 28, 2007, the College Board, released district, state, and national results from students in the 2007 graduating class who chose to participate in the SAT Reasoning Test (formally known as SAT I: Reasoning Test) and/or the SAT Subject Tests (formally known as SAT II: Subject Test). The SAT is designed to assess many of the verbal and mathematics skills that are important to a student's success in college.

Nearly all of the graduating class of 2007 were administered a new format of the SAT introduced in March 2005. The new version has enhanced mathematics content, more critical reading, and a new writing section. Both versions of the SAT feature scales which range from 200 to 800 for each test, to allow for comparison of the old and new versions. The old Mathematics and Verbal scores can be compared with the new Mathematics and Critical Reading scores, respectively. The Writing test, however, is completely new; comparisons with years prior to 2005 are not possible.

The 2007, 2006, and 2005 SAT mean scores for the Critical Reading, Mathematics, and Writing tests are presented in Table 1 for the district, the state, and the nation. Individual school SAT results for 2007 and 2006 are presented in Table 2. School summary scores are not presented if fewer than 10 students participated; however, the data for these schools are included in the district and state results.
